Thank you for using your vote as a Co-op Member.

In the face of immense challenge in

2020, our Co-op rose to the occasion and adapted quickly so we could feed the nation and look after our communities. I'm incredibly proud of how our Co-op has supported people through the worst of the crisis and we know that our values and our businesses will have a big part to play as we move beyond the pandemic and seek to create a fairer world.

There's real power in co-operation and despite us being apart, we've all rallied together to tackle issues that are affecting society and Council is keen to keep this momentum going. I particularly want to recognise our amazing frontline colleagues for putting our members and customers first to continue providing an excellent service; I was thrilled to hear we were increasing their pay to align to the Real Living Wage in recognition of their hard work. This is something Council has long been fighting for.

For the first time ever, we took our Join in Live events online in 2020. inviting members and customers to ioin us from the comfort of their own homes to find out how to get more from Co-op Membership. We had some great discussions on mobilising communities to use our new plastic film recycling scheme and ways we can continue to support people with their wellbeing, with the feedback going on to help shape plans and priorities. At last year's AGM, one of our Council Members, Kat Rose, incorporated members' views into a motion on climate change - asking the business to accelerate its plans and do more to fight it. We exist to meet the needs of our members and working together on a motion is a great example of democracy in action, so it was important to us that we involved them in our discussions and gained their thoughts and ideas for 2021's motions too. Through a survey on Join in, we heard that climate change remains a major concern for our members and that they would like to see us do more to tackle food poverty and support vulnerable people in our communities, so we worked with the business to draft motions in these areas for this year's AGM; if these issues matter to you, please use your vote and have your say.

In 2020, we also reached a huge milestone with our Member Pioneer programme, which was developed by Council in 2017. Now, we have 1,000 Member Pioneers connecting communities around the UK and making them better places to live, work, play and learn by locally delivering our campaigns and initiatives.

Looking to the future

This July, I'll have completed my final term as Council President, so I'd like to take this opportunity to say thank you to our members for your continued support - you're helping us make a huge difference and shape a Co-op that's fit for the future.

Council has worked hard for and with our members since the

National Members' Council was formed in 2015 but there's still lots more to do. I'm looking forward to continuing my time as a Council Member and being a part of what happens next, especially around better representing our wonderfully diverse communities and eliminating the injustices that people are facing.

Now, it's over to you. It's time to choose who you want as a voice for you and your community at the heart of our Co-op.

Lead the Council and Senate and promote Co-op values and principles externally to members, colleagues and customers.


Encouraging Diversity

The pie charts on this page show the current diversity of our Members' Council.

Our Co-op exists to meet the needs of our members, but we know that we can only do this if we're able to represent the different voices of everyone we serve and support. That's why we're committed to improving the diversity of our Council.

Each year we pilot new initiatives to encourage under-represented members to stand for election, whether in respect of ethnicity, age, disability, gender or any other diversity category. We ask candidates for diversity information to help measure our progress.
